## points of interest

- Camp Oven Challenge is held annually on the Sunday of the Queen's Birthday long weekend in June. Held at Pine Plains Lodge, rub shoulders with some of Australia's best bush cooks.
- Dog Trials take place on the Sunday of the Long Weekend in March at the Recreation Reserve. Working Sheep Dogs are part of the Patchewollock backdrop and the event pays tribute to the men, women and dogs who work together in these rural communities.
- Solf & Gun Club provides a bush wilderness for the adventurous golfer. Fairways are maintained for one week per year, during the Annual Patchewollock Golf Tournament held in August. The Gun Club is hugely successful with over 50 members. There are 10 shoots per year, now running a 2 day shoot in June.
- Historic Mural is located in the Patchewollock Memorial Community Centre and measures 5 x 4.5mts. The Mural is a project of the Arts and Crafts Group and depicts the environmental factors which have impacted on the lives of Patchewollock's women over the years.
- Mallee Hen Sculptures were created by artist, Phil Rigg and were installed in 2013.
- Mallee Sunset Retreat is located on the old primary school site and provides 16 powered sites, laundry, playground and BBQ area. T. 0499 110 807 or contact the Patchewollock Hotel.
- Historical Centre located adjacent to the Patchewollock Memorial Community Centre the historic display contains photographs, newspapers and local school memorabilia. Open by appointment, please visit the Rural Transaction Centre for further information.

- > Patchewollock Hotel 'Patche Pub' is famous for country hospitality. Providing lunch and dinner pub styled meals, historic displays, accommodation, swimming pool and cold beverages. (03) 5084 1280
- Patchewollock Music Festival is held annually on the third weekend in October and features over 50 performers from around Australia. The Festival entertains crowds over three days and the program includes music, dance, comedy, yarn-spinning, bush tucker, farm art and sheep racing.
- > Pine Plains Lodge is constructed from drop logs and provides a welcome alternative from camping. The O'Sullivan family has been associated with Pine Plains for over 120 years and are happy to share with you their knowledge of the area in regards to flora and fauna, bush hikes and driving tracks. - > Rural Transaction Centre is a community operated enterprise providing mail services, groceries, takeaway food, banking facilities, tourist information and internet access. (03) 5084 1242
- Silo Art of local farmer Noodle Hulland is an amazing mural created by artist Fintan Magee in 2016. The gigantic artwork is part of the Silo Art Trail and is a spectacular site for photography enthusiasts.
- Wilf's Historic Farming Collection is situated on the corner of Currawa and Barnes Streets in the old St Barnabas Anglican Church. Jam packed with old farming items, the gold coin entry is donated to the Cancer Council.
